IMPORTANT NOTICE

Kindly note that:

- 1. As from 8 December 2014, this document serves as the application form, and incorporates the requisite documents that are to be submitted together with the application for the necessary environmental authorisations in terms of the said Acts.
- 2. This application form is applicable while the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Amendment Act of 2008 is in effect, as the form may require amendment should the Act be further amended.
- 3. Applicants are required to apply for the necessary water use licence and any other authorisations or licences to the relevant competent authorities as required by the relevant legislation. Upon acceptance of an application for a right or permit in terms of the MPRDA, applicants will be required to provide evidence to the Regional Manager that a water use licence has been applied for.
- 4. The Regional Manager will respond to the application and provide the reference and correspondence details of the Competent Authority, and in the event that the application for a right or permit is accepted, together with the date by which the relevant environmental reports must be submitted. Notwithstanding anything that may appear to be stated to the contrary in the acceptance letter, the timeframes are in fact aligned and the prescribed timeframes for the submission of documents as regulated by the NEMA regulations must be strictly adhered to.
- 5. The application must be typed within the spaces provided in the form. The sizes of the spaces provided are not necessarily indicative of the amount of information to be provided. Spaces are provided in tabular format and will extend automatically when each space is filled with typing.
- 6. The failure to submit complete information as required in this application form may result in the refusal of the application for an environmental authorisation and consequently of the right or permit applied for.
- 7. This application must be submitted through the SAMRAD online application system of the Department of Mineral Resources under "Other documents to upload".
- 8. Unless protected by law, all information filled in on this application form will become public information on receipt by the competent authority. Any interested and affected party should and shall be provided with the information contained in this application on request, during any stage of the application process.
- 9. Please note that an application fee is payable in terms of the National Environmental Management Act and the National Waste Management Act, which fees must be paid upon lodgement of the application. Should the said application fees not be paid as prescribed the application for a right or permit in terms of the Mineral and Petroleum Resources Development Act cannot be considered to have been made in the prescribed manner and the said

1. CONSULTATION BASIC ASSESSMENT AND/ OR SCOPING REPORT

This is an application for mine expansion (including NEMA Part 2 amendments) requiring a NEMA S&EIR.

Tshedza Mining Resources (Pty) Ltd (Tshedza) a subsidiary of Mbuyelo Coal (Pty) Ltd. has an approved Mining Right (MR) (Ref No: MP 30/5/1/2/2/297 MR) and Environmental Management Programme (EMPR), in terms of the Minerals and Petroleum Resources Development Act (Act 28 of 2002, as amended) (MPRDA), for the mining of coal at Manungu Colliery. The existing and approved mining operations are situated on portions 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of the farms Weilaagte 271 IR, situated in the Victor Khanye Local Municipality within the Nkangala District Municipality (Mpumalanga Province). The mine has been in operation since mid-2015. Tshedza wishes to expand the mining operations to extend the life of mine (LOM) until approximately FY 2040/2041. The proposed areas within which the expansion of mining operations would take place, are all within the existing approved mining right boundary, however these areas were not specifically included and assessed in the previous Environmental Impact Assessment (EIA) and Water Use Licence Application (WULA).

Environmental Impact Assessment Regulations, 2010 (Regulations), on the 19th of March 2014, by the Mpumpalanga Department of Economic Development, Environment and Tourism (MDEDET). An Integrated Water Use Licence (IWUL) for Section 21 (a), (c), (g), (i) and (j) water uses in terms of chapter 4 of the National Water Act (Act 36 of 1998) was granted for water uses associated with opencast mining on the 23rd of February 2015 (License No 04/B20A/ACGIJ/2621). The current approved EA and IWUL only covers portions 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of the farm Weilaagte 271 IR. The mine has been in operation since mid-2015 and the estimated Life of Mine (LOM) is planned for approximately 30 years. In order to extend the mining operations outside of the current approved EA and IWUL (i.e.: outside of the approved portions of land), further EA and IWUL authorisation are required (hence this application).

In addition to the expansion of the mining operations, amendments to certain existing conditions are being applied for to align the conditions with the current and proposed future works. These NEMA Part 2 amendments will be incorporated into this S&EIR process.

In order to enhance the quality of the coal product (beneficiation of product), Tshedza wishes to incorporate a wash plant into their current crushing and screening plant. The inclusion of the wash plant will necessitate an amendment to the existing Mine Works Programme (MWP) as well as an amendment to the existing approved EMPR which will be undertaken through this EIA application process.

Interested and Affected Parties (I&AP's) have been notified of the project via registered letters, emails and facsimiles including distribution of a BID. Site notices and posters have been places in and around the application area. Two separate initial notification 30-day commenting periods have been undertaken for this project due to amendments to the scope of work following the first notification. The initial project plan was to only include a wash plant into the existing plant area however following consultation, it was identified that the cumulative impacts of mining should be considered. As such, the proposed mine expansion now caters for the 30-year life of mine.

The initial notifications included a questionnaire requesting comment on the proposed project. Site notices have been placed in and around the proposed expansion application area; in addition, newspaper advertisements were placed in the newspapers which are widely distributed in the area and advertisements were placed in the provincial Government Gazettes. The public participation process has been, and will

continue to be, undertaken in accordance with the NEMA process and the 2014 Regulations. I&AP's have been provided two (2) initial notification and call to register period of 30 days each. The scoping report will be made available for public review and comment for a period of 30 days, within the prescribed timeframes following submission of this Application Form. A further period of 60 days will be provided to I&AP's to comment on the EIA/EMPR during that phase of the application process. The 60 days will ensure that the Water Use Licence technical report (that will form part of the EIA report) complies with the consultation requirements as specified in the NWA GNR 267.

The information submitted by I&AP's via any form will be utilised during the Impact Assessment and compilation of the Scoping and EIAR/EMPR.

The identification of potential impacts and risks for assessment will be undertaken through I&AP consultation and the development of an in depth understanding of the activities, actions and processes to be undertaken on site based on the EAP's experience with similar projects as well as input from specialists. As such, the potential impacts and risks on broad environmental aspects, in respect of each of the main project actions, activities and processes will be assessed during the Scoping and EIA process.

The impact assessment methodology to be used is guided by the requirements of the NEMA EIA Regulations. Determination of Environmental Risk:

The significance (S) of an impact is determined by applying a prioritisation factor (PF) to the environmental risk (ER).

The environmental risk is dependent on the consequence (C) of the particular impact and the probability (P) of the impact occurring. Consequence is determined through the consideration of the Nature (N), Extent (E), Duration (D), Magnitude (M), and reversibility (R) applicable to the specific impact.

For the purpose of this methodology the consequence of the impact is represented by:

The impact ER will be determined for each impact without relevant management and mitigation measures (pre-mitigation), as well as post implementation of relevant management and mitigation measures (post-mitigation). This allows for a prediction in the degree to which the impact can be managed/mitigated.

Impact Prioritisation:

Further to the assessment criteria presented above it is necessary to assess each potentially significant impact in terms of:

- Cumulative impacts; and
- The degree to which the impact may cause irreplaceable loss of resources.

In addition, it is important that the public opinion and sentiment regarding the development and consequent potential impacts is considered in the decision-making process. In an effort to ensure that these factors are considered, an impact prioritisation factor (PF) will be applied to each impact ER (post-mitigation). This prioritisation factor does not aim to detract from the risk ratings but rather to focus the attention of the decision-making authority on the higher priority/significance issues and impacts. In order to determine the final impact significance, the PF is multiplied by the ER of the post mitigation scoring. The ultimate aim of the PF is to be able to increase the post mitigation environmental risk rating by a full ranking class, if all the priority attributes are high (i.e. if an impact comes out with a medium environmental risk after the conventional impact rating, but there is significant cumulative impact potential, significant public response, and significant potential for irreplaceable loss of resources, then the net result would be to upscale the impact to a high significance).

Several EIA-phase specialist studies have been undertaken to address the key issues. The specialist studies involved the gathering of data relevant to identifying and assessing environmental impacts that may occur as a result of the proposed project. These impacts were then assessed according to pre-defined rating scales. Specialists also recommended appropriate mitigation / control or optimisation measures to minimise potential negative impacts or enhance potential benefits, respectively. The following specialist studies have been conducted:

- Hydrological assessment;
- Hydropedology assessment;
- Geohydrology assessment;
- Biodiversity, soils and wetlands assessment;
- Heritage and paleontolgical assessment;
- Air quality assessment;

All specialists were required to adhere to the the EAPs method of assessing impacts, as detailed above. The specialist studies will inform the EIA phase assessment (EIAR/EMPR) with input into the sensitivity mapping.

All registered IAPs will be informed of the required process of involvement as defined by the EIA regulations. Responses will be prepared and distributed to those IAPs who submitted comments and/or objections. These comments /objections and responses will be recorded in an Issues and Responses Report (IRR) for inclusion into the Scoping Report and EIA Report respectively. In addition, the registered IAPs will be given an opportunity to comment on all reports prepared to be submitted to the DMR.

Closure objectives

The EMPR shall include a closure and rehabilitation plan. The plan shall outline the closure objectives which are aimed at reinstating the landform, land use and vegetation units to the pre-mining land use or similar.

Remove all infrastructure built in relation to the mining operations which will

The quantum for financial provision will be calculated using the DMR's preferred methodology and guideline document titled "Guideline Document for the Evaluation of the Quantum of Closure-Related Financial Provision Provided by a Mine (2005)" and the latest applicable Master Rates.

The rehabilitation cost will be calculated in detail with input from the various specialists assigned to the project and will be subject to annual review. Furthermore, the rehabilitation cost will also be based on implementation of the management measures to be included in the EMPR and revised accordingly for inclusion into the EIA.



1. Decision

To undertake the following activity (hereafter referred to as "the activity"):

The proposed EIA listed activities within Manungu Colliery on Portion 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of the farm Weilaagte 271 IR and Welgevonden 272 IR within the Victor Khanye Local Municipality, Mpumalanga Province at the co-ordinates 26° 14.63197"S and 28° 41.232648"E, Activity 11, 12 and 22 of Government Notice R544 of 18 June 2010.

The activity will entail the following:

- Mining activities (opencast workings, dust suppression, dewatering of the pits, coal/overburden stockpiles and backfilling of the pits, soil stockpiles);
- Infrastructure (offices, change rooms, workshops, stores and other ancillary infrastructure);
- Roads;
- Water management infrastructure (trenches, berms and pollution control dam);
- · Sewage treatment plant;
- Portable crusher

The granting of this environmental authorisation is subject to the conditions set out below.

3. Conditions of Authorisation

Scope of authorisation

- 3.1 Authorisation of the activity is subject to the conditions contained in this authorisation, which form part of the environmental authorisation and are binding on the holder of the authorisation.
- 3.2 The holder of the authorisation must ensure compliance with these conditions by any person acting on his or her behalf, including but not limited to, an agent, sub-contractor, employee or person rendering a service to the holder of the authorisation.
- 3.3 The activity which is authorised may only be carried out at the property indicated above.







- 3.4 Any changes to, or deviations from, the project description set out in this authorisation must be approved, in writing, by the Department before such changes or deviations may be effected. In assessing whether to grant such approval or not, the Department may request such information as it deems necessary to evaluate the significance and impacts of such changes or deviations and it may be necessary for the holder of the authorisation to apply for further authorisation in terms of the regulations.
- 3.5 In the event that the impacts exceed the significance as predicted in the environmental impact report, authorisation may be suspended after proper procedures have been followed.
- 3.6 In the event of any dispute concerning the significance of a particular impact, the opinion of the Department in respect of its significance will prevail.
- 3.7 The Department may change or amend any of the conditions of this authorisation if, in the opinion of the Department, it is environmentally justified.
- 3.8 This activity must commence within a period of three (3) years from the date of issue. If commencement of the activity does not occur within that period, the authorisation lapses and a new application for environmental authorisation must be made in order for the activity to be undertaken.
- 3.9 The holder of this authorisation is responsible for compliance with the provisions for Duty of Care and Remediation of Environmental Damage contained in Section 28 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act 107 of 1998).
- 3.10 This authorisation does not negate the holder of the authorisation, responsibility to comply with any other statutory requirements that may be applicable to the undertaking of the activity.

Appeal of authorisation

- 3.11 The holder of the authorisation must notify every registered interested and affected party, in writing and within twelve (12) days of the date of this decision, of the outcome of the application.
- 3.12 The notification referred to above, must
 - a) Specify the date on which the authorisation was issued;
 - b) Inform the interested and affected party of the appeal procedure provided for in Chapter 7 of the Regulations; and
 - Advise the interested and affected party to the manner in which the decision can be accessed;
 - d) Be published in the newspaper contemplated in Regulation 54(2)(c) and which newspaper was used for the placing of advertisements as part of the public participation process.

Management and monitoring of the activity

- 3.13 The Environmental Management Programme (EMPr) dated 13thDecember 2013 and submitted as part of the Basic Assessment Report is hereby approved and must be implemented and adhered to throughout the lifecycle of the activity.
- 3.14 The applicant must appoint an Environmental Control Officer (ECO) that will have the responsibility of monitoring and reporting on compliance with the conditions of this environmental authorisation as well as monitoring and reporting on the implementation of the approved EMPr.
- 3.14.1 The ECO must be appointed before the commencement of construction and the Department must be notified of such an appointment for communication purposes.
 - 3.14.2 The ECO must oversee and monitor the success of all rehabilitation activities.
 - 3.14.3 During the construction phase, the ECO must submit monthly compliance reports to the Department in writing and copy the applicant with such reports. Where applicable, the ECO may negotiate the required frequency for the submission of reports with the Department, which must be agreed to in writing by the Department.





The reports must include a description of all activities on site, problems identified, transgressions noted and remedial action implemented. All reports must reflect the Department's reference number of the project on the cover page.

- 3.14.4 The ECO must maintain the following on site:
 - A site diary
 - Copies of all reports submitted to the Department
 - A complaints' register of all environmental complaints regarding the proposed project and the remedies applied to such complaints
- 3.14.5 The ECO must remain employed until all rehabilitation measures as well as site clean-up are completed and the site is handed over to the applicant by the contractor for operation.
- 3.15 The holder of the authorisation must submit an environmental audit report to the Department upon completion of the construction and rehabilitation activities. The environmental audit report must be compiled by an independent environmental auditor and must indicate the date of the audit, the name of the auditor and the outcome of the audit in terms of compliance with the conditions of this authorisation as well as the requirements of the EMPr.
- 3.16 The Department retains the right to monitor and/ or inspect the proposed development during both construction and operational phases.

Commissioning and operation of the activity

- 3.17 Fourteen (14) days written notice must be given to the Department that the activity will commence. Commencement for the purposes of this condition includes site preparation. The notice must include a date on which it is anticipated that the activity will commence, and must include the name and contact details of the appointed ECO.
- 3.18 The Contractor must be familiar with and adhere to, any local by-laws and regulations regarding the generation of noise and hours of operation. If a construction crew is accommodated on site it must be in accordance with the local authority's (Municipality) by-laws.
- 3.19 Affected parties on or in the vicinity of the site, including in particular surrounding landowners and any official responsible for existing installations on the site, must be advised in advance of avoidable disturbances.
- 3.20 The Contractor must ensure that the construction crew attends an environmental briefing and training session presented by the ECO prior to commencing of site activities.
- 3.21 All Employees must undergo the necessary safety training and wear the necessary protective training clothing at all times.
- 3.22 The construction camp must be located on a level area at least 50m from any watercourse/riparian zones, and the Constructor must attend to the drainage of the campsite to avoid sheet erosion and/or stagnant water.
- 3.23 The design of water management facilities should include suitable erosion protection measures to ensure that downstream erosion is minimized.
- 3.24 Temporary ablution facilities i.e. chemical toilets must be provided for construction personnel for the duration of the construction
- 3.25 The ablution facilities must not be closer than 50m from any watercourse.
- 3.26 The chemical toilets must be emptied and maintained in a working order throughout the construction period.
- 3.27 No fire must be ignited with the intent to destroy the flora on site and surrounding properties.
- 3.28 The Contractor is responsible for ensuring that there is access to clean drinking water for all employees on site.
- 3.29 Construction work must be undertaken in demarcated and designated areas in order to avoid unnecessary disturbance to faunal habitat and potential displacement of fauna.

- 3.30 Property owners and residents in close vicinity of the mine must be warned beforehand of any blasting activity.
- 3.31 Subsoil and hard overburden stockpiles must not exceed a height of 6m.
- 3.32 Dust suppressions must be conducted on a daily basis by making use of water carts.
- 3.33 There must be no discharges from the site without a Water Use License.
- Excess water in the pit that interferes with mine operations and/or endangers the workplace 3.34 must be removed (as per conditions of Water Use License)
- 3.35 Mixing of all chemicals and hazardous substances must take place on an impermeable surface
- 3.36 All discard materials produced during construction must be taken off site and deposited in an accredited landfill site.
- 3.37 A suitable leak proof container for the storage of oiled equipment must be established.
- 3.38 Fuels and flammable materials must be stored in sultably equipped storage areas complying with generated fire safety requirements, impervious materials are to be used in these storage areas to prevent contamination of the ground in the event of spillages and
- Areas where construction activities are prohibited are referred to as No-Go areas and must 3.39 be demarcated to ensure that environmentally sensitive areas are not impacted by the construction activities.
- 3.40 The contractor must ensure that there is always a supply of absorbent material readily available to absorb breakdown spills.
- An integrated waste management approach must be used, based on the principles of waste 3.41 avoidance, minimization, reduction, reuse and recycling of materials and containers for glass, paper, metals and plastics must be provided.
- 3.42 The contractor must prevent the pollution of surface as well as groundwater.
- 3.43 Water management for residue deposits and water management for surface activities must be in line with Best Practice Guidelines (DWA)
- 3.44 If any heritage resources of significance are exposed during the construction of the pollution control dam, the SAHRA must be notified and construction activities must cease immediately.

General

- 3.45 A copy of this authorisation must be kept at the property where the activity will be undertaken. The authorisation must be produced to any authorised official of the Department who requests to see it and must be made available for inspection by any employee or agent of the holder of the authorisation who works or undertakes work at the property.
- 3.46 Where any of the applicant's contact details change, including the name of the responsible person, the physical or postal address and/or telephonic details, the applicant must notify the Department as soon as new details become known to the applicant
- 3.47 The holder of this authorisation must notify the Department, in writing, within twenty-four (24) hours if any condition of this authorisation is not adhered to. Any notification in terms of this condition must be accompanied by reasons for the non-compliance
- 3.48 Non-compliance with a condition of this authorisation may result in criminal prosecution or other actions provided for in the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 and the regulations.

Annexure 1: Reasons for the Decision

1. Background

1.1 The applicant, Tshedza Mining Resources (Pty) Ltd, applied for authorisation to carry out the following activity:

The proposed EIA listed activities within Manungu Colliery on Portions 5, 6, 7, 8 and 9 of the farm Weilaagte 271 IR and Welgevonden 272 IR within Victor Khanye Local Municipality, Mpumalanga Province at the co-ordinates 26° 14.63197"S and 28°

41.232648"E, Activity 11, 12 and 22 of Government Notice R544 of 18 June 2010.

The activity will entail the following:

- Mining activities (opencast workings, dust suppression, dewatering of the pits, coal/overburden stockpiles and backfilling of the pits, soil stockpiles);
- Infrastructure (offices, change rooms, workshops, stores and other ancillary infrastructure):
- Roads:
- Water management infrastructure (trenches, berms and pollution control dam);

2. Information considered in making the decision.

In reaching its decision, the Department took the following into consideration:

- a) The information contained in the Basic Assessment Report and the EMPr.
- b) The objective and requirements of relevant legislation, policies and guidelines, including Section 2 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998); and
- c) The findings of the site visit undertaken by Okwethu-kuhle Fakude on 19thFebruary 2014.

3. Key factors considered in making the decision.

All information presented to the Department was taken into account in the Department's consideration of the application. A summary of the issues which, in the Department's view, were of the most significance is set out below:

- a) The proposed project will benefit the greater Delmas area during the commencement of the mining operation at Manungu Colliery as it will result in the creation of a number of employment opportunities.
- b) The production and sale of coal will ensure a constant flow of foreign capital into South Africa and into the project region.
- c) There will be small, micro and medium enterprise development on the local communities and the surrounding areas in line with the duration of mining.





d) Infrastructure will development in the area.

4. Findings

After consideration of the information and factors listed above, the Department made the following findings:

a) No significant detrimental environmental impacts are anticipated, should the mitigation measures stipulated in the Basic Assessment report and conditions of this environmental authorisation be implemented and adhered to.

b) There were signs of cultural heritage significance (graves on site)discovered during the Heritage Impact Assessment, undertaken by Archaetons Culture and Cultural Resources Consultants but the mining activities will not be undertaken anywhere near the graves, however the graves must be fenced, to ensure that they are not impacted upon by the mining operations.

In view of the above, the Department is satisfied that, subject to compliance with the conditions contained in the environmental authorisation, the proposed activity will not conflict with the general objectives of integrated environmental management as laid down in Chapter 5 of the National Environmental Management Act, 1998 (Act No. 107 of 1998) and that any potentially detrimental environmental impacts resulting from the proposed activity can be mitigated for to acceptable levels. Authorisation is accordingly granted.




Figure 2 Site Notice 3_ Site notice place on the T-junction of the R42 and R50 just outside the town of Delmas (-26, 222478; 28, 693264)
